## **APPENDIX:** Officers' Reports: Chair (Chris Poole)

Welcome to this AGM, and thank you for attending, and thanks especially to Sue Buxton who has arranged the following supper. This year has seen us slowly get back to a new normal of club activities.

Of our Level C events in the last year we had a very successful 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event at Shotover, with over 320 participants, after which we saw a fair few TVOC 50<sup>th</sup> bandanas shooting around other events. We saw a few less participants at just over 290 at Hodgemoor in April, and finally our Chiltern Challenge at Wendover in October had over 400 participants, partially helped by it also being the RAF Championships.

On our Saturday series we managed to organise four events, January in Park Wood with 130+, April at Wittenham Clumps with 80+, then we had to wait until October for Coombe Hill and 70+ and finally in November at Chesham for 115 participants.

Our summer series ran 10 events, ranging from 11 to 29 participants but averaging at 18.

We were unable to put together an Oxford Street Series this year.

When things are generally taken into consideration, our Summer Series creates a small surplus, these events really are to keep a potential weekly fix of orienteering with a chat, pie and a pint (non drivers) afterwards. The Saturday series swings between profit and loss depending on the number of participants, and loo hire costs, but this series is predominantly to attract new people to the sport and ideally to TVOC. The Level C and above events are the ones that generate the income to keep the club running.

That is all fine, but the major un-costed resource is people. We have excellent planners, organisers and mappers, very effective event team leaders that mobilise our enthusiastic and helpful teams on the day of events. Without this we could not operate and my thanks go out to all those that help out in any way they can. And I fully understand that family commitments mean that not everybody is able to help every time, but any help is appreciated, so thank you to all those that could lend a hand.

However, it is the same small nucleus of people that are doing the organising and planning of events. This may be because people are daunted by the potential task or think that there are plenty of people in the club doing this. I can assure you neither view is true, if you come forward to organise or plan there is lots of help available as well as many written guides to help you out. So if you fancy a go at these roles, try it out first at one of our Saturday or Summer events.

As a club we have a few key events in the next year, with the Chiltern Challenge in February, and we are doing a lot of support to the British Orienteering Championships, and are the lead club for the British Relay Championships on the 25/26 March 23. So that will be a busy start to the year, expect to hear from your team leaders for help particularly on the 26 March at Hambleden.

If we get the people, we expect to put on a Saturday Series event each month, but we are not yet certain if or how we can run the Summer and Oxford Street Series, but we are hopeful that we can get some events on for you all.

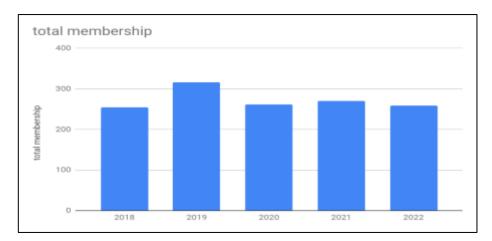

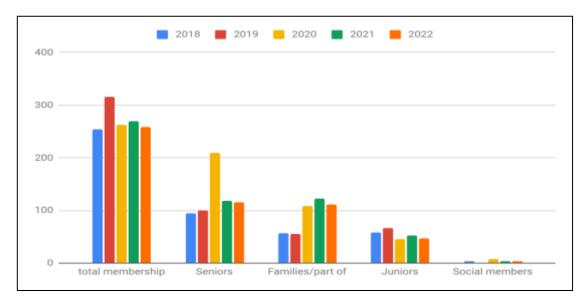

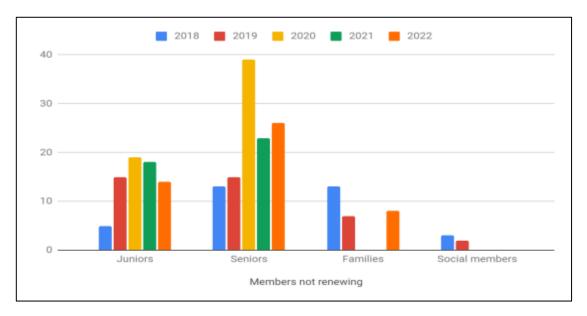

Total membership - after a high in 2019 has been stable in the last three years

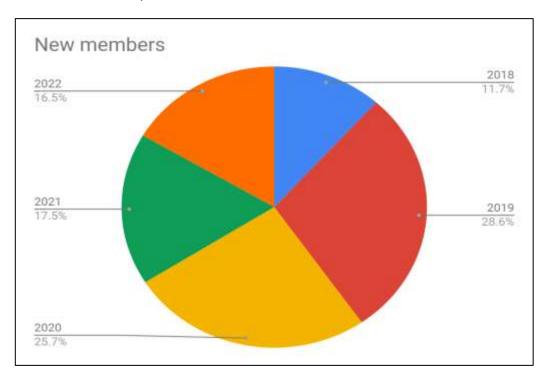
## Membership types compared 2018-2022
